



Palamau, a drought-prone area in Jharkhand, is known as the Black Shadow zone. The average ainfall here is below normal. Kaushal Kishore Jaiswal is on a mission to bring greenery back to this rea. Villagers who were earlier not aware of the significance of trees and the role they play in the environment have now realised their importance. They believe that Jaiswal's mission is a much-needed one in the village. People will have a better environment and their economic condition will improve with the sale of fruits and vegetables from these trees.
